The benefits of teamwork

Teamwork = the ability of a group of people to work well together to successfully complete a task

"Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much." "Snowflakes are one of nature's most fragile things, but just look what they can do when they stick together." "There is immense power when a group of people with similar interests gets together to work toward the same goals."

A teamwork example:

During a Formula 1 race, the tyres on the cars wear out. If the tyres are not changed at this point, then the drivers might lose control and crash their cars.

However, stopping to change the tyres takes time. In a race, it is important that you do not waste any time at all. Therefore, the teams must change the tyres as quickly as possible.

The record for changing the tyres on a car is 1.88 seconds. That is less than 2 seconds to change all 4 tyres. This is only possible if all the members of the team know exactly what they each need to do and do it quickly and efficiently.


